# Knowstone Parish Hall Annual Activity Report 2024

This has been another busy year for the Parish Hall Committee with a regular schedule of events and new exciting projects for Hall improvements. Financially the Parish Hall Trust is on firm footing. The operational account for the financial year ending in Sep 2024 showed a surplus thanks to the extra efforts taken by the Trustees. The rest of 2024 has been stable with the addition of the Batsworthy Fund grants for improvement projects. The projects will be detailed at the end of this report.

#### **Events**

During the past year we successfully delivered the following schedule of events:

Coffee mornings	Coffee mornings have continued monthly and been well attended by locals and people from surrounding parishes. We have been commended for our excellent cakes baked by various trustees and parishioners. The proceeds went towards the Hall funds.
The Big Breakfast	In January we held our first Big Breakfast offering a full English and variations.  Claire Cave from Ford Farm supplied the delicious sausages and helped on the day – thank you, Claire. Our cook extraordinaire, Kim Newton, masterminded the menu and cooked the dishes. In fact, it was so popular that we held another one in May combined with a coffee morning and raised a very respectable £329.74!

Summer Ceilidh	Following last year's success, we organised another Ceilidh with a new band — The Oggle Band. They were very entertaining and provided an excellent evening of dancing and laughter. Mike & Max's catering van served delicious food before the event. We also provided a licensed bar offering a selection of cider, beer, wine and non-alcoholic options. We use the Knowstone Facebook (FB) page for advertising and sharing posts across similar local FB pages. Gill Smith has also developed collaboration between all the local Hall Committees aiming to share knowledge and avoid scheduling prominent events at the same time as others. She also hosted the first Halls collaborative evening at our Hall. We had a useful evening getting to know people from other teams and sharing experiences and tips.

The Hall is also used for regular events organised by some of our parishioners. These include:

Parishioners have also used the Hall for other events such as meetings, parties, a children's Christmas party and wakes.

### **Projects**

As the Batsworthy Fund finally opened for grant applications after a couple of years of inactivity, we were able to apply for several grants from the Fund. These grants will help to fund: a new kitchen, new lightweight staging and a new shed. Late in the autumn we received the acceptance, and the monies were paid in December.

#### New Kitchen

Over the past two years we have considered a couple of different options for a new kitchen. Originally, we thought of refurbishing the old kitchen space with a new layout. However, the new idea from Kim Newton to relocate the kitchen to the current storage space accessible directly from the main hall, was the agreed approach. Kim has used her kitchen management skills and experience to develop the layout and specification for the new kitchen. She was able to source the new kitchen furniture and appliances at a good price, so we already have all these in storage. The plan is to get the new kitchen space ready for installation and then have it fitted and ready for use. The old kitchen will then be dismantled and prepared to be used as storage space. We are currently in the process of finalising the costs for the required building and electrical works. Once that is all agreed, the project will proceed.

## New Staging and New Shed

The old staging is proving cumbersome to manage as the main hall is regularly used for activities such as pickleball which requires the floor space to be clear. Therefore, Martin has applied for a small grant from Batsworthy to purchase modular modern lightweight staging. The staging has arrived and has been tested. Next step is to either dispose of the old staging or offer it to anyone wanting to purchase it for a small donation.

The second small grant Martin applied for was for a new larger shed. This is also part of the new kitchen project as we will require some additional storage space. It will also be an opportunity to review the contents of the old shed and dispose of any superfluous items. We have received the monies, and Martin is in the process of ordering the shed.

I would like to give Martin Smith special mention of thanks as he has taken on not only the weekly cleaning of the Hall but also the grounds maintenance in addition to looking after the general building maintenance. This has enabled us to make savings thus contributing the surplus mentioned at beginning of this report.

Here's to successful 2025 full of fun and beneficial activities for our community. We are looking forward to welcoming new team members and anyone who wants to come and get involved in any of our events and activities.
